

Rich Reflections

"Come & See! There's still time!"
No it's not a President's Day mattress sale, neither is it the Toyota Year End Sales Event.

But it IS the best week (time) of the year--even if it isn't Christmas and doesn't look like Spring. We've been eating, opening new doors, mentoring, praying & lighting candles together.

Sunday, March 26 we saw <u>our largest post-pandemic attendance</u>... so far, with both familiar & new faces!

We've heard the words "come & see" many times in the Gospel of John: Disciples telling their siblings, an outcast Samaritan woman to her village, Mary telling Jesus about her dead brother Lazarus. Jesus has been finding doubting, rejected, grieving people and bringing them out of dark times and into the light of a new day--helping them see the re-born, new life that He brings.

And whether you're excited, weary, wary, fearful or uncertain--Jesus, and we, are here with and for you.

<u>Holy Week</u> offers many opportunities to make these **the most important days of the year** as we follow Jesus:

April 2

<u>Palm Sunday 10am</u>: we see Jesus welcomed as a hero by ordinary people hungry for something better.

April 6

Holy Thursday 6:30pm: we surround and support our 5th graders in hearing again for the first time those words of promise:

"This is my body broken, my blood shed for you" reassuring words that nothing can separated us from God's love.

April 7

Good Friday 12noon: a new community worship service, with several congregations, helping us to see even in the shadows and darkness of the cross, there is no limit to God's love for you and me. A recorded version of it will be on YouTube and Facebook, by 3pm.

April 9

Not even death can hold or stop God's new life for

us in Jesus. "Alleluia, Christ is risen! He is risen indeed, Alleluia!

During our Wednesday worship during Lent we listened to Christian leader and author Rachel Held Evans from a series called "<u>A New Family: Throwing Open the Doors of the Church</u>" Here's some of what she had to say in this season of death and resurrection.

The role of the church is to preach death and resurrection, to teach that Christ has died, Christ is risen. Christ will come again. Jesus said that the gates of hell will not prevail against the church and I take him at his word in that. I think if the gates of hell will not prevail against the church, it's going to survive the loss of cultural Christianity in the US. We know the church will survive, because the church is about death and resurrection. It may die, but Jesus will make something new of it.

So I don't worry about the future of the church. A lot of people are talking about the death of the church, like it's this big horrible thing that we're on the precipice of doom. And, we see the numbers changing, at least in North America, and shifting, the demographics shifting. And I can't help but think to myself, maybe a little death and resurrection is exactly what the church needs right now.

Maybe this means that for Christians in North America, we're learning that Christianity isn't about empire. Maybe our empire building days are over. And maybe that's a good thing. Maybe the church isn't about power and money and numbers. Maybe being the church is about something else. And maybe dying to those old ways of doing things is exactly what needs to happen.

See you in church as we celebrate the surprising new life we have in Jesus.
