
News from our Church Council President

Sisters & Brothers in Christ,

There are so many ways to say goodbye. And yet few if any are truly adequate. Many times our words can't fully convey the fullness of our thoughts and feelings. And occasionally we try to find something "nice" to say but rings hollow from our mouths to others' ears. But we've found lots of songs to try:

"So long farewell, auf Wiedersehen, goodnight."

"Happy trails to you"

"Goodnight sleep tight, and pleasant dreams to you"

"I'm so glad we had this time together."

"God be with you till we meet again."

"I Will Remember You"

...mostly these efforts tend to minimize the difficulty of heading in new and different directions.

Even Dr. Seuss's wonderful efforts to acknowledge the gratitude and the grief fall short, if only because it oversimplifies our feelings. *"Don't cry because it's over, smile because it happened."*

The most helpful model I've come across is from the Hospice Community of caregivers. They say there are Four Gifts to express when we know a departure is imminent.

I love you. Thank you. I'm sorry and/or I forgive. Goodbye (for now).

Normally we have a ritual of farewell during a final worship service, but we weren't able to have the necessary leaders present. Here's what part of that would have looked like:

Pastor: Thank you to all of you, the members of Osakis Lutheran Church; for the love, kindness and support shown to me during this journey. I ask your understanding and forgiveness for mistakes I have made and for expectations unmet. I am grateful for your acceptance of my leadership. I will continue to remember with joy the many things we have shared together. As I leave, I carry with me many memories of our life together.

People: We receive your thanks, and offer you forgiveness for any mistakes. We give thanks for your presence and your work among us. We ask your forgiveness for our shortcomings in faith and life. Your influence on our lives will not leave us even though you now depart from us.

Pastor: I forgive you for any shortcomings. I also welcome and accept your gratitude, trusting that our time together and our new ventures are pleasing to God.

Jesus calls us to reach out and care for the lost, the last and the least; in the hungry, the poor, the unemployed, the imprisoned, the wide variety of emotional, physical and developmental disabilities. People who are easy to overlook. I noticed that several of the people who have made special efforts to say farewell to us are those who are often overlooked by others. So I was humbled that they made efforts to make sure our mutual parting was not overlooked. We've shared so many things during nearly 9 years. Food shelf drives, alternative giving Christmas presents, getting Backpack Attack program going in Osakis, Holy Humor Sundays, Habitat for Humanity projects, God's Work Our Hands Sundays, Lenten Prayer around the Cross, National Youth Gatherings, baptisms, first Communions, affirmations of baptisms, blessings of graduating seniors, weddings, funerals (of <u>many</u> long-time members), and of course the COVID pandemic.

The pandemic uncertainties, creative adaptations, frustrations, and long-term stresses made big impacts on homes, schools, workplaces and churches alike. It was a difficult time, but also a learning time.

MY BIGGEST HOPE as I depart is that Osakis Lutheran will find ways to gather around social events and meals, and get to know people across ages and interests. This seems to be a challenge going back prior to my arrival. May you all rediscover the joy of getting to know one another more personally and more deeply.

I'll leave you with this favorite prayer of mine:

O God, you have called your servants to ventures of which we cannot see the ending, by paths as yet untrodden, through perils unknown. Give us faith to go out with good courage, not knowing where we go, but only that your hand is leading us and your love supporting us; through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen

And finally a word of wisdom for you <u>and</u> for me, from a beloved Lutheran pastor and theologian. *"Remember the best, forgive the rest."* – Gerhard Frost

Vacation Bible School Council Report	
Vacation Bible School took place July 10th-13th, 2023 from 8:45-3:00 each day, Monday-Thursday. 28 students attended, with 13 of them being members and 15 being nonmembers. Families were charged \$25 per child, which included 2 snacks each day, a lunch each day, and a t-shirt. There were 3 counselors from Luther Crest who came to implement all the programming and bring all the supplies necessary. Next year's potential date is July 8-11, 2024.	
The week went great! The students were enthused to come each day and often chose to skip their other activities! Lots of food and supplies were donated by members of the congregation— Thank you!!! We had great compliments from the parents and community members. The counselors really enjoyed the week as well.	
We had an Outdoor Movie Night during VBS week on Wednesday, July 12th on the empty lot at 300 West Queen Street (across from the softball fields). Information was sent home with VBS students and Latchkey students at the school. It was also posted on Facebook and in the bulletin. Flavor Shack food truck set up around 5:00 and the movie started around 8:30 pm (The Mario Brothers Movie). At the time of the start of the movie, around 110 people were present, not counting some visiting the food truck and then leaving. The Youth sold pop, water, candy, and glow necklaces and made around \$200 (\$248 total between 2 movie nightsfirst one was June 28th)! Supplies were purchased with a Thrivent Action Plan grant. We don't have plans to do any more movie nights this summer, but are hoping to have one per month next year. We're looking at maybe some indoor movie times during the colder months.
