

Carol Kruschke, a summer quilter, reports from St. Stephen's Human Services in Minneapolis: as many as 1385 people need shelter each night. Shocking? On a good note, housing has been found for 437 people. We have sent quilts and winter clothing to that facility. How can you help?

Now finalized, is the listing of items delivered to Hensley Trucking by Don and Sheila on October 31. To Lutheran World Relief: 60 quilts, 81 personal care kits. To Global Health Ministries: 69 Newborn kits, 47 Hospice/Aids Kits, 640 bandages, 64 pillowcases, 38 sheets. Thanks to all who helped in any way!

Osakis Lutheran Church Council Meeting, Wednesday, November 7, 2018 7:30 p.m.

Present: Brent Werven, Jerry Wiggins, Paul Christensen, Mike Curtis, Lil Ortendahl, Melanie Stier, Jill Ramey, Pastor Rich, Nancy Exley, Wilma Triebenbach, Diane Zimmel and Kathy Ryan.

President Jerry Wiggins called the meeting to order.

Pastor Rich gave devotions.

Highs and Lows

Paul Christensen motioned to accept the minutes of the last meeting. Mike Curtis 2nd. Approved.

Committee Reports:

- 1. Treasurer's report: Most bills for October are paid. Checkbook balance is \$1,309.00 as of October 31, 2018. October income was \$9,925.81 with expenses being \$10,400.81. Income to date is \$115,292.83 and expenses are \$114,344.14. Lil Ortendahl motioned to accept Treasurer's report. Wilma Triebenbach 2nd. Approved.
- 2. Trustees' report: Replacement window for fellowship hall is here. Installed this morning. Regarding the front entryway being fixed by Jason Wiggins, Lil suggested putting \$1,000 in his account to finish the job, but Jerry said there was still some money left. If more money is needed, Council will address that. Have been talking to Mr. Spanswick about the two pillars out front and about some kind of extension to get water away from the building. Requests for use of the church: Triebenbach benefit for lung cancer, Girl Scouts and Boy Scouts.
- 3. Pastor report: Wedding Oct. 20th. Affirmation of Baptism October 28. Advent theme "Draw Near". Continuing Education process theology. Middle School retreat at Luther Crest on November 18 Pastor would like to attend so he is trying to find someone to take the service. Would have to postpone a baptism scheduled for that day.
- 4. Church in Society: November and December Alternative Giving Campaign will be asking the congregation to help fund a clean water well for a community somewhere in the world. All undesignated gifts will go towards this (\$2,500). We will still have catalogs available for "Chick for Check" selections.
- 5. Education: Next meeting November 28 at 7:30 p.m.
- 6. Youth: November 18, Chili Cook Off after church. Also, will begin Christmas Cookie sale, adding a few items this year to order in advance; chicken noodle soup, brownies in a jar and lasagna. Order pick up will be on December 16 with other baked goods available for purchase that day. Next meeting is after November 18.
- 7. Stewardship: Received 38 pledges so far with estimate giving totaling about \$67,00.00. Pledge cards are still available.
- 8. Worship: See Pastors' report.

New Business: Nancy passed out budgets turned in so far. Waiting on Worship and Personnel. Please have budgets with any changes in by December 17. Also Annual reports for Annual book. Our Annual meeting is January 27, 2018. Nancy said she would like to close out the Parament Fund (\$45.00 in it and change to National Youth Gathering Fund and this would be name change only on the account). The \$45 would be left in the account for future parament use. In addition, she would like to have a single memorial fund, keeping track within it what is designated and what isn't.

ELCA Investment Fund Demand Checking. Will get a check from the bank for the Addie Finseth CD upon written request from Council documented in minutes. Mike Curtis made a motion to terminate Certificate of Deposit #23981; asking that a check for those funds be made payable to the Osakis Lutheran Church. Jill Ramey 2nd. Approved. (copy of termination is attached)

Signers for the new account, ELCA Mission Investment Fund Demand Checking will be Paul Christensen, President Elect, Kathy Ryan, Council Secretary and Nancy Exley, Church Treasurer. Wilma Triebenbach made a motion to approve establishment of the new Mission Investment Fund Demand Checking with the check from the Addie Finseth CD and with those listed as signers. Jill Ramey 2nd. Approved.

New Bishop will be appointed June 7-9, 2019. We are invited to recommend up to three person. Will put this on the agenda for December.

Next meeting: Sunday, December 9, 2018 at 5:00 p.m. at the Parsonage. Bring appetizers.
