Our mandate is to be constantly looking to consider the needs of other people and inviting them into a relationship with Jesus. Unless our churches have a strong approach to increasing inevitability, we will fail to live out the mandate that Jesus called us to in the great Commission.

Inviting someone to church is just the first step towards discipleship and evangelism. Invitation shouldn't be reserved for "super; Christians" who see it as their duty, but it needs to be come a normal practice for all Christians!

During this season of Advent and Christmas we are invited into the amazing story that leads to the birth of Jesus Christ. It is a story that is filled with invitations. Mary and Joeph are inviting to take this incredible journey though visits with an angel. The shepherds are invited to go and see by yet another angel. Pat Ryan did research and received an estimate back in 2020 from MAAS-ROWE Carillons, Inc. and at that time the estimated cost for the repair was \$6,800.00.

### **STEWARDSHIP**

As we near the end of the year, I wanted to give an update on our financial situation.
